2 | About Re:Match / Re:MatchJob

Re:Match is BGP’s flagship social-innovation project, co-funded by the European Social Fund (ESF) and the Deutsche Postcode Lotterie. Using an algorithm-based matching procedure, we relocate Ukrainian refugees currently hosted in Poland to German municipalities on the basis of their individual profiles and preferences. This project phase will place a special emphasis on participants’ labour-market qualifications and the skills needs of local economies.

3 | Your Role

As **Project Lead** you carry end-to-end responsibility for the project’s successful delivery, impact and compliance. You will manage a multidisciplinary team (policy & advocacy, tech, data science, evaluation) and be the primary interface to donors, partners and municipalities.

Essential

- Master’s degree (or equivalent practical expertise) in social / political sciences, public policy, migration studies, labour-market economics, human rights, international relations or a related field.
- ≥ 4 years’ track record leading complex, multi-partner projects, incl. budget oversight (> €1 m) and donor reporting.
- Thematic expertise in migration, asylum and labour-market or integration policy (Germany & EU).
- Familiarity with evaluation methodologies (theory of change, contribution analysis, cost-benefit, etc.).
- Demonstrated ability to convene and facilitate diverse stakeholders (cities, NGOs, ministries, tech teams).
- Excellent analytical and writing skills; publication record or comparable outputs.
- **Languages:** native/C2 German and fluent English (C1+).

Desirable

- Familiarity with data-driven social-innovation or civic-tech projects.
- Previous work with city administrations or European city networks.
- Ukrainian or Russian language skills.
